## Description

**Identifier:** HFC

**Dates:** c.1900s-1960s

**Scope and Content:** Personal papers of educationalist, Frederick Crossfield Happold (1893-1971). Includes his own writings and other papers relating to Bishop Wordsworth's School, Salisbury. The collection was listed following the order of the materials in their original box. The collection also contains books which were donated by Happold with his papers. The books were integrated into the Rare Book Collection.

**History:** Frederick Crossfield Happold, (1893–1971) was an educational pioneer, headmaster, and author. He was a supporter of child-centred education and often wrote on methods of teaching history.

He was born Scotforth, Lancashire and educated at Lancaster Royal Grammar School and Rydal Penrhos School. He studied at Peterhouse, Cambridge before enlisting second lieutenant in the Loyal Regiment (North Lancashire) in 1914.

After the War, Happold taught at Perse School, Cambridge. In 1928 he was appointed the headmaster at Bishop Wordsworth's School, Salisbury, where he remained until his retirement in 1960. Happold instituted the Company of Service and Honour at the school, a scheme to improve his pupils' understanding of community.

He was a founding member of the New Education Fellowship (later World Education Fellowship), an organisation which focused on the child-centred education, social reform through education, democracy, world citizenship, international understanding and the promotion of world peace. He was also an advocate for source-based history study in schools. He published books and papers on education and theology. He died in 1971.

In 1969, he donated his papers and books to Lancaster University as he had grown up in the local area. The books had previously been held in Bishop Wordsworth's School, Salisbury. The books were integrated into the Library's collection and the papers were retained as a distinct collection. Further books were donated by his son in 1972.
